Game on

Famed for its beautiful weather and mild temperatures in the autumn, winter and spring months, Cyprus is ideal for pre-season training between November and April, attracting top-flight football teams who arrive to play on football pitches of the highest standard as they prepare for the season ahead. Given the close proximity to central and eastern European countries, great flight connectivity, and the allure of training under sun-drenched skies, well known teams such as CSKA Moscow, Udinese, Rapid Vienna, Ajax Youth Academy and many more (as well as women's national squads from around Europe) have arrived to sharpen their skills on Cypriot fields.











The island boasts over 100 football facilities – including top tier national stadiums, grass fields, athletic facilities and training resources – all within close proximity, while the country's modern infrastructure ensures a smooth stay that runs like clockwork, enhanced by helpful professional staff assisting with transport and equipment.

Friendly matches are also popular on the island, with support and the provision of referees for training offered by the Cyprus Football Association. The ideal setting for all kinds of football tournaments, any visit to the island can be combined with the perfect stay in competitively priced high-quality hotels, giving players and their families the chance to indulge in the ultimate time out.







Wheels in motion

Speed your way along flat stretches of undeveloped coastline or take heed of the gentle crunch of your tires while traversing Cyprus' rocky and rugged interior. With over 70 well mapped cycling routes weaving their way through varied rural and urban areas, and the additional appeal of an excellent road network with little traffic, the island is a firm favourite for professional and recreational bikers alike. The perfect escape for intrepid travellers who choose to delight in the glories of road cycling or mountain biking – from cross country to downhill – rapid changes in terrain and blissful conditions set the scene for the most inspiring vacation on the saddle any time of the year.











An attractive training destination for well-known teams such as the Belgian National Team, the British Olympic Association and the Netherlands Olympic Committee, Cyprus has also lured international champions and Olympic Gold Medallists including Jaroslav Kulhavy, Sabine Spitz, Thomas Frischknecht and many more, competing, training and testing their endurance on challenging terrain. World class champions and amateur riders from around the world also descend on the island each year to partake in the thrilling Cyprus Sunshine Epic, one of the most challenging mountain bike races on the UCI Calendar, while the world famous L'Etape Cyprus by Tour de France and Cyprus Gran Fondo attract many road cycling athletes, amateurs and teams to ride in the sunshine.

Cyclingcyprus.info (the island's official cycling information website) lists numerous bike centres conveniently located across the country offering bike rentals, services, route information and assistance. The website also presents the island's various cycling routes with descriptions, maps, altitude diagrams, and downloadable routes in GPX format. Information on hotels friendly to cyclists is also provided, whether you are visiting the island for vacation, for a specific event or for targeted training.

SWIMMING







Making strides

An island cocooned by crystal-clear calm Mediterranean waters that consistently rank among the cleanest in Europe is nothing short of a swimmer's paradise, with its sweeping soft sand coast-line interspersed by rocky outcrops and secret pebbled coves. Beyond the shimmering seas, avid water-lovers and professional swimmers can take advantage of stunning 25m and 50m open air Olympic sized swimming pools of 8-10 lanes, heated when necessary in the cooler months. Complete with one metre diving boards, three metre springboards and ten metre platforms, supplementary equipment, underwater viewing and filming windows are also available. In total, the island is home to five Olympic-sized swimming pools, with two in Pafos and the rest in Lemesos, Larnaka and Lefkosia respectively.











The ideal location for training in idyllic conditions, Cyprus has welcomed major teams from across Europe to prepare for top events in its swimming pools, from the British and Swedish Olympic swimming teams, to the Dutch, Finish and Austrian national squads. All professional swimming pools on the island are conveniently located close to first-class hotel facilities, with easy access to major airports, making transfers and travel incredibly easy, and allowing for the organisation of hassle free well-coordinated training camps. The island's key sites and major attractions are also within easy reach for moments of enjoyable downtime, while those who opt to train in one of the island's major seaside towns can make the most of refreshing dips in the sea.

Open water swimming camps are also organised in Cyprus, suitable for professionals and amateurs, while fun events including the Cyprus International Swimming Marathon, the Cyprus Swim Series, Nicosia International Swimming Gran Prix and the International Limassol Swim Meet attract swimmers from around the world.

Full speed ahead

Skim the waves of the clear blue, pedal through cycling trails off the beaten track, reach new heights in a sun-kissed mountain terrain speckled with wildflowers and alive with the intoxicating scent of herbs, and sprint alongside the glistening waters of the Med. But training in all-year round warm weather conditions isn't just about exciting escapades in nature.







Olympic-sized swimming pools and state of the art running tracks near handy facilities and accommodation add to the appeal of the island for any avid sportsman who seeks an adrenaline rush abroad in the autumn/winter and spring months.

In more recent years, fitness enthusiasts and athletes have been flocking to the island's golden shores from near and far for exhilarating triathlons, indulging in their beloved sport in the most favourable island conditions. The Ayia Napa Triathlon is a particularly popular annual event, attracting beginners and pro-athletes to swim, bike and run in one of Cyprus' most popular coastal resorts revered for its translucent turquoise seas.

The Ocean Lava Pafos is another swim-bike-run event adding to the annual adrenaline-fuelled fun, which sees triathletes test their endurance against the brilliant backdrop of a UNESCO World Heritage seaside town.





Going the distance

Practicing the sport that you love or training for a big event takes on a magical appeal in Cyprus, laced with an incredible network of trails calling out to all running enthusiasts. The short distances between country and coast add to the exciting experience, whether taking on an uphill challenge, running a good bend, or enjoying a downhill sprint.

And around every corner, the island's multi-layered past jumps to life, as myths and legends entice the curious at heart in a landscape dressed in a fine patchwork of vivid green and golden-brown hues.





Cyprus has also become a popular hot-spot for international marathons, with local and international runners perfecting their stride turnover in the most thrilling events across beautiful parts of the country. The mythical birthplace of the Ancient Greek Goddess of love and beauty sets the perfect scene for the annual Pafos marathon, while Cyprus' most hip and happening cosmopolitan seaside hub plays host to the well-known Limassol Marathon which lures thousands of athletes and excited spectators every year.

All things contemporary perfectly fuse with historic city tales in the island's capital during the Nicosia Marathon, while the Larnaka Marathon gets hearts racing by palm fringed promenades. Not just about serious sport, organisers are keen on giving international athletes and spectators alike the chance to enjoy vibrant outdoor cultural entertainment and plenty of Mediterranean-inspired fun, post-race.


Leaps & bounds

A desirable destination for international athletes looking to train in a warm hospitable environment, Cyprus is home to fully equipped outdoor athletic facilities, providing the ideal training ground for national teams and individual sportsmen keen on serious pre-season training in the balmy climes of the Mediterranean.











Cyprus has welcomed members of British, Belgian and German athletic federations who have chosen the island for their track and field training, as well as many internationally acclaimed athletes from around Europe. All major towns on the island boast modern sports complexes with specifications and technical features to suit all needs – including extensive grounds and meeting rooms – with a wide range of technical equipment available.

Athletes in need of rest, recuperation and medical care can also benefit from their visit to Cyprus, whether they choose to undergo treatment for a sports-related injury at one of the island's progressive medical centres, need targeted professional physiotherapy, or simply wish to kick back and rejuvenate body and mind after an intense period of training. To this aid, healing spas and wellness centres offer sports massage and a wide range of alternative treatments and therapies to soothe and lift the spirits.

SHOOTING:

Eye on the target



Cyprus is incredibly proud of its international shooting champions, most notably Olympic finalist and European skeet shooting champion, Georgios Achilleos, and has placed great focus on giving some of the world's greatest sportsmen the ideal facilities to train and practice their skill behind the trigger.











Now renowned for its facilities of exceptionally high standard, the island boasts two Olympic shooting ranges which have hosted world class events, one in Lefkosia and one in the Larnaka district, as well as an international shooting range in Lemesos, and smaller ranges in Paralimni and Pafos, each with excellent facilities for professionals and keen amateurs. Open for trap, skeet and double trap, sporting kal compak sporting training around the year, safety is paramount at all ranges – guns and ammunition are safely stored – while refreshments and food curb hunger pangs at the house restaurants and cafeterias.

The Cyprus Shooting Sport Federation is highly active, and organises national and international competitions, attracting professionals to the island to compete in prestigious events such as The Cyprus Grand Prix Trap-Skeet, the ISSF World Cup Shotgun and Cyprus Grand Prix Compak-Sporting. The Cyprus Shooting Sport Federation is affiliated with the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF), the European Shooting Confederation (ESC), the Federation Internationale de Tir Aux Armes Sportives de Chasse (FITASC) and the Commonwealth Shooting Federation (CSF).

DIVING:

Taking the plunge



Sandy shores and crystal-clear seas may captivate the senses, but there is far more to Cyprus than what first meets the eye. Curious travellers keen to scratch beneath the surface, will discover a whole new paradise set to astound any professional diver and delight the keen adventurer.







Renowned for its calm warm waters between 16°C-27 °C, favourable year-round weather conditions, diverse Mediterranean marine life and fantastic underwater visibility, Cyprus attracts keen scuba divers and free divers of all levels – from beginners to international divemasters – and enjoys one of the longest diving seasons in the region. Top-class diving centres and schools across the island adhere to international guidelines and regulations as members of the Cyprus Federation of Underwater Activities, while catering to all diving enthusiasts. As such, they offer a variety of international diving courses and certifications, including PADI, NAUI, SSI, CMAS, AIDA and more, while providing quality diving equipment under the guidance of fully-qualified instructors.

Over 55 top-ranking dive sites add to the appeal of the island, with tranquil waters endowed with spectacular underwater caves and tunnels, paths adorned with ancient amphora, natural and artificial coral reefs, and a variety of mesmerising wrecks adding to the mysteries of the deep. The sunken wreck of Zenobia off the coast of Larnaka is a real spectacle of the seas, rated as one of the world's top dive sites, while submerged sites of archaeological significance such as the Mazotos Shipwreck (dating to the late classical period) attracts those with a fascination for the past. Stunning new artificial reefs and dive sites add to the underwater appeal, while international scuba diving teams and free-diving athletes can make the most of the island's seas for both training and competitions.

The sky's the limit

Choose Cyprus for your sporting adventure, and a world of exciting leisure possibilities await, whether indulging your wanderlust on a solo escape or enjoying an extended stay with friends and family. Beaches of every kind beckon, from rocky, wild and windswept to sandy and serene, backed by sleepy seaside towns providing an ideal escape. Here, active types can enjoy every watersport imaginable by sun kissed shores or escape from the norm with a languorous sailing trip around the island's coast.

Further inland, the tranquil countryside sets an altogether different scene, where quiet undulating lands invite travellers to enjoy leisurely hikes and walks through rich landscapes scattered with remnants of a bygone era. Travellers can even get better acquainted with the island's hidden tales by partaking in themed itineraries that provide deeper insight into the country's history, culture and gastronomy.

For the holistically minded, wellness retreats tucked away in serene surroundings offer the ultimate getaway, a world away from reality.
