

Golf Tourism - Par for the Course

Cyprus is emerging as a leading destination for golf tourism thanks to a number of factors that combine to make it a golfing sanctuary.

The favourable sunshine climate of the Mediterranean ensures that the sport can be enjoyed all-year-round on the island. This is further enhanced by the stunning natural surroundings that have been cleverly and sensitively incorporated into the signature courses designed by some of the world's most renowned golf course architects.

At present, there are four international standard, 18-hole golf courses; all concentrated in the breath-taking and historic Pafos region on the southwest of the island. They mark the start of the master plan for a total of 14 golf courses across the island under the 'Golf Development Policy', which seeks to expand the status of Cyprus as a premium and preferred golfing destination both in the Mediterranean and globally. And with the island's high calibre of existing golf courses and resorts that continue to garner awards and accolades, the island is fast becoming a major player in golf tourism.









Regulated to the Highest Standards

Golfing in Cyprus is regulated by the Cyprus Golf Federation (CGF), which is the official governing body for golf in Cyprus.

The CGF was established in 2000 and is registered with the Cyprus Sports Organisation (KOA) and the Cyprus Olympic Committee (KOE). It is also a member of the International Golf Federation (IGF), the European Golf Association (EGA) and is associated with the Royal and Ancient Club of St. Andrews (R&A). Under its umbrella it organises the Cyprus Open Golf Championships, international matches and other events, and coordinates the annual golfing programmes of member and affiliated clubs. Included among the major tournaments

is the annual 'Cyprus Amateur Open Championships', which attracts over 100 golfers from across the world.

All golf courses in Cyprus have been slope rated according to the USGA/EGA slope rating system and all CGF member clubs adhere to and use the EGA handicapping system. The Official distance measurement unit of the CGF is the metre (m).





Few places are so tranquil for a friendly game, elevated tees invite everyone to "have a go" and yet narrow tree-lined fairways provide a challenge, with each shot requiring careful assessment. The opening nine holes is the shorter half of the course, encircling the historic monastery, vineyards, orchards and olive trees, while the back nine holes are all about precision. The newly designed 10^{th} hole is a perfect example of the accurate insight to the challenges you will face. It may be hard to concentrate on dramatically elevated tees because of the picture perfect views, but you will need a well-struck tee shot over the valley to find the generous fairway. In addition, the short Par 4 14th offers the best risk and reward tee shot on the course. The green can be reached with a well-struck drive, although danger lurks with the steep valley cascading away. The ultimate test is the Par 3 15th hole, an impressive island green and Minthis' signature hole.
















Dream Breaks

Combining a golfing holiday with a break for all the family, friends or travel party is easy in Cyprus where there is so much to do off the green - all-year-round - and for every age and taste.

Whilst the island's golf courses are currently concentrated in the Pafos region (visitpafos.org.cy), the rest of the island also awaits with a unique character and experience to be found in each region city and village.



Sand & Sea

Blue Flag awarded, organised coasts can be found all across the island. Boasting some of the world's cleanest seawaters that are shallow and safe, Cyprus beaches offer a complete day out with the addition of sand playgrounds, water sports and modern conveniences (sun loungers, parasols, changing rooms, WCs, lifeguard tower, disabled facilities, kiosks, food and drink).

Diving and snorkelling at top ranking wreck sites and artificial reefs, including the world-famous Zenobia can be enjoyed alongside other sea sports and pursuits such as kitesurfing, SUP, jet skiing, paragliding, fun inflatables, boat rides and cruises, sailing, yachting, and fishing.



Gastronomy

Cyprus is famous for its fresh, Mediterranean gastronomy that can be savoured in the many traditional tavernas where the famous 'meze' meal comprised of numerous. small dishes can be shared. The freshest fish is served at restaurants centred around the quaint fishing harbours, whilst there is an endless selection of international fine dining, casual eateries, modern cafes, and popular fast-food chains.

Artisan local food can be discovered in rural and mountainous villages where delicacies are prepared in the traditional way. Visitors can watch the production of cheeses, cured meats, desserts of grape, honey and carob, spoon sweets, breads, rusks and preserves, and more – as well as sample them.

Viticulture

The island's winemaking industry is mainly found in Lemesos' and Paphfos' mountainous area. The Lemesos winemaking community, in just an hour's distance from Pafphos' villages, is home of the Commandaria – a sweet dessert wine that is the world's oldest named wine still in production. You can opt to take a self-guided tour following the thematic wine routes that take pass through villages, vineyards and wineries, or visit select boutique wineries for their organised grape harvests, informative tours and wine tasting.

History & Culture

With over 11,000 years of history, the remnants of the island's past create a rich cultural tapestry of monuments, museums, castles, mosaics, ruins, Venetian bridges, churches, sites of worship, and many more interesting and historically significant treasures. A series of self-guided cultural routes has been created by the Deputy Tourism of Ministry encompassing wine, religion and history, as well as downloadable audio guides for some of the island's most significant landmarks.

For lovers of the arts, the island offers a year-round cultural programme of high-calibre local and international dance, music, theatre and art in contemporary theatres and galleries, as well as outdoors



on seafront stages, at village squares, and in amphitheatres - both new and ancient.

Active Pursuits & Adventure

Thanks to the favourable year-round climate, outdoor sports and activities can be enjoyed in abundance. The island features a network of city, coastal and mountain trails for cycling, walking and hiking and also welcomes athletes and teams for training and tournaments in state-of-the-art facilities for football, tennis, volleyball, clay shooting and more.

Local, Pan-European and International marathons, sailing regattas, cycling tournaments, car rallies, golf tournaments and other big events are also held on the



island on an annual basis.

More thrilling and extreme activities can be found on the island for those looking for a taste of adventure. A variety of different jeep safaris are on offer and extreme sports such as Kitesurfing and free diving come with a real 'kick'. The favourable weather conditions, stunning rugged backdrops,

complex rock types, and the quality, variety and diversity of Cyprus' climbing routes (both traditional and sport) are seeing rock climbing and orienteering emerge as popular pastimes that come with a shot of adrenaline.

For complete days out, organised excursions with various themes are available throughout the year from sightseeing tour operators. Excursions are a great way to discover the island, complemented by information and insights. The organised trips take in a delightful array of attractions, sights and activities, including rural villages, mountain communities, traditional practises, natural bounties, historical treasures, significant monuments, and more.

Children's Activities

Younger visitors will delight in the family-friendly and fun atmosphere of the island where all ages are warmly welcomed and catered for. A variety of theme parks, water parks, funfairs, animal parks and zoos provide memorable days out for the whole family. Modern malls, cinemas, bowling alleys, indoor play places, arcades and interactive workshops offer activities for the whole family.

Nature

The Troodos mountain range is a natural and cool oasis comprised of pine forests, waterfalls and nature trails that encounter rare and endemic flora and fauna along the way. During the winter season when the mainland remains temperate, there is often snow on the higher peaks, making Troodos a favourite destination for skiing.



The island has been blessed with a wealth of natural beauty spots, and there are a number of national forest parks, protected nature reserves and salt lakes that are considered to be highly significant ecosystems. A topography of caves, gorges, ravines, sand dunes, mountains,

orchards, groves and countryside are perfect for a number of outdoor activities such as cycling, walking, hiking, rock climbing, birdwatching and foraging for wild herbs and edibles.

The Pafos region in particular is considered to be home to some of the island's most stunning natural areas, including the Akamas Reserve Park and Pafos Forest.

The Akamas Reserve Park covers an area of around 230 km² that encompasses the Lara Bay turtle nesting beach and Avakas gorge, which is naturally carved from limestone. The park is home to over 500 species of indigenous flora, making it of huge ecological significance. A number of nature trails wind through the park, passing through stunning scenery and rewarding with magnificent, panoramic views.

Pafos Forest incorporates Cedar Valley, which is distinctive for its thousands of endemic Cedrus brevifolia species (Cedar trees), which is a close relative of the famous cedars of Lebanon, as well as clusters of pine trees. The forest unfolds into Stavros tis Psokas, an additional mountain locality that is home to the rare and shy Mouflon (Ovis gmelini ophion) an endemic species of wild sheep found exclusively on the island.

Traditional Experiences

Away from the bustling and modern cities, a cluster of rural and mountainous villages offer a more authentic Cypriot experience with agrotourism and long-practised folkloric handicrafts such as pottery, lace making, filigree silver, basket weaving, woodworking, sculpting, copper works, iconography and more.

The quaint, traditional villages perched on hillsides offer a taste of olden Cyprus



with narrow, cobbled lanes and stone architecture. Exploring the traditional

neighbourhoods always reveals something interesting about the island's past and many locals welcome visitors to watch them create the artisan local delicacies and traditional pastimes at their workshops.

Shopping Therapy

Shopping in Cyprus offers the best of all worlds. Quaint handicraft stores and independent boutiques combine with high-street brands and designer labels for a retail experience that spans the streets of the town centre to expansive, modern malls. In particular, visitors to Cyprus make sure to pick up items that are competitively priced and well-made, such as goods made of leather, gold and silver, as well as unique pieces of pottery, basketry, icons and wood that make the perfect memento of your visit.

Cosmopolitan Lifestyle

Cyprus is a modern and progressive destination that offers a cosmopolitan lifestyle filled with good times - both day



and night!

Its favourable climate allows for a bustling 24/7 vibe that is never hampered by inclement weather and there is always somewhere to mingle and mix.

Known for its thriving coffee culture and an appetite for hearty food and a shared drink or two, Cyprus offers a lively, compelling ambience across seafronts and city centres, whilst the tradition of festivals means there is always a celebration to join in.

A healthy culture of leisure, entertainment and enjoying life to the full is felt through al fresco drinking or dining, family entertainment and a pulsating nightlife with an active club scene that is balanced by the elegance of fine dining and exclusive wine bars.
